Archaeology

The US Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Services is funding archaeological investigations of various Natural Resource Conservation Service properties. (\$30,000 Mann)

Biological and Environmental Sciences

Savannah River Nuclear Solutions, LLC through the Department of Energy, has granted a subcontract to study the *Factors Controlling the Long Term Stability and Exchange Rate of Mercury sorbed on Adsorbents Amendments Deployed in Soil/Sediment*. (\$69,691 Miller)

A subcontract with Auburn University has brought funding from the National Science Foundation for Aquatic Refuge and Recovery in the Face of Drought in a Biodiversity Hotspot. (\$38,385 Helms)

A sub-agreement has been completed with Texas State University and Auburn University to support endangered species research projects on freshwater mussels. (\$23,418 Helms)
