There was discussion about the course titles being the same. Lt. John Strayn explained that “the titles are standardized throughout Air Force ROTC. Every Detachment across the nation should offer the same courses each semester. In order to help the students identify what course to take for each semester we have added Part 1 and Part 2 to identify the semester for the course seeing the name does not change with in the year group. These names are predetermined at Air Force level.” All Members voted to approve.

SOCIAL SCIENCE EDUCATION

Students seeking Alabama teacher certification should complete the social science major with a general social science concentration and select education as a second major. Students should consult their education advisers concerning all certification requirements and with their academic discipline adviser for requirements in the major. **Education students will need to take coursework to include the following disciplines: Geography, History, Political Science, and Economics.*
